(Sorted highest to lowest)

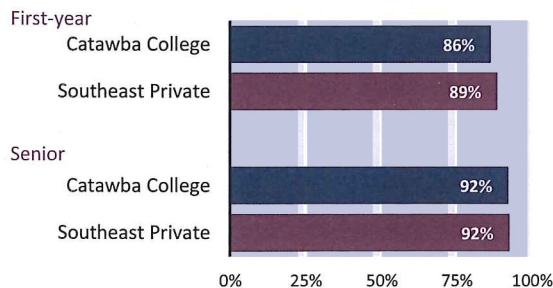
Percentage of Seniors Responding
"Very much" or "Quite a bit"



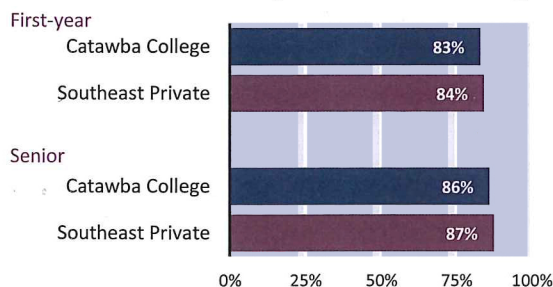
Satisfaction with Catawba College

as "Excellent" or "Good"



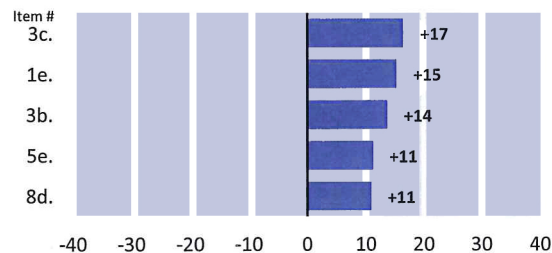
Percentage Who Would "Definitely" or "Probably" Attend This Institution Again
