

## 2021 THEME: FAITH WORKS

**What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill', and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith without works, and I by my works will show you my faith.**

**James 2:14-18**

This year's theme has some of our favorite things: A good theological conversation and a good play on words. Let's break down some of the aspects of the theme that we will explore this summer:

How does **Faith Work** in your life? Does it inform how you understand and respond to the issues going on in the world, your community, your family, and yourself?

Do I have to choose **Faith** or **Works**? How do we understand the theological meaning of the faith versus works debate? We cannot earn the grace and love of God through our works, but as James says, "Faith without works is dead." What do you think about this? What have others throughout Christian History thought about it?

How does **Faith** inform **Work**: How can you live out your faith through your career? Should your faith inform what job you choose and how you do that job, even if it isn't a ministry profession? What is God calling you to do with your life?

And most importantly, this theme poses an authentic question about how to live faithful lives. Here at Discover we are all about growing in our faith and discerning our vocation(s)- our calling-what we are called to do with our lives. Faith. And work(s). This summer we will dig deeper into how our faith informs what we do in a variety of ways, and how what we do with our lives can and should be informed by our faith--both in the big picture and in the details.
